
County Health Survey: Health Problems Affecting Health of a Community



<u>Cultural</u>


- Stigma and shame

- Belief that illnesses are personal weaknesses

Structural


- Lack of bilingual and culturally competent providers
- Lack of interpreters and language translation services in the health and human services professions
- Challenges navigating the health care system
- Interventions poorly adapted for diverse patients

Eligibility

- Age 18+
- Montgomery County resident
- Living at or below 250% FPL
- Uninsured <u>and</u> uninsurable (e.g., undocumented)


Application Process

- Apply at one of 9 participating primary care clinics
- Proof of residency and income, a form of ID
- Renewal required <u>every year</u>

Provides Access To...

- Primary care at 9 clinic organizations with max. \$35 copay
- Generic medication through Community Pharmacy program
- Limited specialty care through Project Access network

Eligibility

- Newborn through age 19
- Montgomery County resident
- Living at or below 250% FPL
- Uninsured and uninsurable


Application Process

- Requires OESS approval
- Proof of residency and income; child ID
- Renewal every <u>two</u> years

- Pediatric primary care including well child visits, sick visits, with max. \$20 copay
- Prescription medication with max. \$5 copay
- Dental care through DHHS
- Limited specialty care network

- Services
 - Crisis services are provided in person or on the phone 24 hours a day/365 day a year. Mobile outreach will respond anywhere within Montgomery County to provide emergency psychiatric evaluations. Full crisis assessment and treatment referrals are provided for all crises, both psychiatric and situation. The program has 4 crisis beds as an alternative to hospitalization for those who are uninsured within the public mental health system

Victim Assistance and Sexual Assault Program (VASAP)

- Services:
- The program provides information and referral, advocacy, crisis and ongoing counseling, support and compensation services for victims of crimes committed in Montgomery County or crime victims who live in Montgomery County. Assistance is also provided to the victims' families and significant others.
- Additional Info: VASAP assists victims of crimes such as rape/sexual assault, homicide, driving while intoxicated (DWI), carjacking, torture, hate crimes, arson, larceny, robbery, auto theft and vandalism.

 - APP provides group supervision to DV offenders, through the Abuser Intervention Program. Shelter assessments and placement at the Betty Ann Krankhe DV short term safety shelter. Court accompany advocate and criminal justice advocacy with Victims Assistant Advocates. Individual and Group Counseling for DV victims, offenders, and children who witness DV. Supervised visits and Safe Exchange at the Safe Passage Center.

Specific services include information regarding substance use assessment and treatment services; assessment of drug and alcohol use as well as other related problems; urine drug screen; referral for drug and alcohol education seminars for youth and families; and referral for appropriate treatment services.

Responsible for public behavioral health system planning, management, and oversight of the local jurisdiction. The LBHA is comprised of the four main units below:


- Contract Monitoring Unit is responsible for invoice payments, renewal of contracts, budget modifications, initiation of all solicitations, annual site visits, and all amendments regarding modifications of the scope of services. The CMU is also the direct liaison and first point of contact for the contracted provider.
- Operations Unit is responsible for oversight, monitoring and planning of community behavioral health programs. It has three core teams in addition to a Special Projects supervisor. The three teams are: Harm Reduction and Prevention Team, Quality Assurance and Compliance Team and the Services Recovery and Supports Team.
- Data and Analytics Unit is responsible for development of monthly dashboard reporting, data presentations, LBHA Annual Data Plan, as well as various behavioral health system surveillance and data related technical support projects. The goal for the Data Team is to facilitate and support data driven local planning processes led by the LBHA.
- Fiscal Unit assists with planning and maintaining LBHA and BHCS finances. This team reviews and manages grants and county budgets, prepares budget reports and budgetary entries due to grant changes, and monitors spending.

After Six Months of Services...

OUTCOMES

- 75% reported increased or sufficient access to healthcare;
- 88% reported good or improved mental health;
- 93% reported increased or sufficient access to community resources;
- 70% reported securing and retaining employment that pays a living wage;
- 82% reported increased or sufficient community involvement; and
- 91% reported improved ability to retain and work with immigration attorney.

How Can I Refer My Clients?

ELIGIBILITY

- All services are FREE and provided regardless of language or country of origin
- Currently residing in Maryland, Washington, D.C. or Northern Virginia
- Already filed or intends to file for humanitarian-based immigration relief

REFERRAL PROCESS

- Client or referring party can complete a new client application at asylumworks.org. Interpretation is available for those who prefer to register by phone
- <u>Waitlist opens at 10AM on the 1st day of the month.</u> We accept 20-25 client household per month so no one client waits more than 90 days to receive services.
