


FY22 Healthcare Initiative Grant Impact Report \$1,421,750 in Capacity, Multi-Year, Emerging Needs & Small Grant Awarded to 43 Nonprofits Serving 142,412 Montgomery County Residents


I. \$1,019,730 Capacity Building Investment served 137,578 Montgomery County residents:

The Healthcare Initiative Foundation (HIF) awarded \$1.019M to #34 Montgomery County based nonprofits through the FY22 Nonprofit Capacity Building Grant Cycle. These community investments lifted the work of our nonprofit partners responding to the ongoing health, social, and economic crises focusing on access to high-quality, comprehensive community health and wellness, and the development of essential healthcare workforce while also allowing space for our nonprofit partners to build capacity for growth and long-term sustainability.






HIF is elated to report that 99% of the capacity building investments went to our priority zip code areas; reaching communities with the lowest life expectancy rates in the county that avehistorically been under-invested in and served.



Accessibility to Foundation investments is paramount and HIF is committed to ensuring that nonprofits whose work aligns with our mission can successfully navigate the grant process. The number of new nonprofits that can access grants, along with the number of BIPOC led organizations, are some of the metrics HIF is monitoring. HIF is pleased to announce that 29% of the nonprofits awarded received HIF's Capacity Building grant for the first time and 38% are BIPOC led organizations.





• \$85,000 invested to support collaborations amongst stakeholders to integrate services and increase effectiveness improving accessibility to health, wellness, and social services.

II. \$127,000 invested in the Emerging Needs Vaccine Fund:

• HIF partnered with Care for Your Health, Global Sustainable Partnerships and Metropolitan Council of Governments to support vaccine tracking and accessibility to serve 1,772 residents.

III. \$200,000K invested in Multi-Year Grants:

• HIF partners with Montgomery College and The Universities at Shady Grove to support a 5 year \$1M Healthcare Workforce Pipeline investment for Nursing, Social Work and Public Health students supporting 150 students to graduation. In its 2nd year, 62 students received scholarships, life stipends, and career coaching and 22 students graduated.

IV. \$75,000 in Small Grants:

• HIF partnered with #17 nonprofits to serve **3,000** Montgomery County residents supporting children in the foster care system, young adults seeking careers in healthcare, pediatric care for UpCounty youth and families, mentorship programs offering haven for youth, and peer support and trainings for the LGBTQIA+ community. 61% of this investment supported youth and family services and 41% supported behavioral health programming.
